



**Ольга Славникова** – российская писательница и журналист. Родилась 23 октября 1957 года в Свердловске (нын. Екатеринбург). В 1997 году выпустила свой первый крупный роман «Стрекоза, увеличенная до размеров собаки», вошедший в шорт-лист «Русского Букера». Роман 1999 года «Один в зеркале» Славникова считает своим лучшим и наиболее недооцененным произведением. Лауреат премии «Русский Букер» (2006, роман «2017»), финалист Национальной литературной премии «Большая книга» (2018, роман «Прыжок в длину»). Книги переведены более чем на 10 иностранных языков. Живет в Москве.

**Olga Slavnikova**, a novelist and critic, was born in 1957 in Sverdlovsk (now Ekaterinburg), in the Urals. She began publishing fiction in the late 1980s, during which time she was also fiction editor, then managing editor, of the literary magazine *Urals*. She is the author of several award-winning novels, including *A Dragonfly Enlarged to the Size of a Dog* and *2017*, which won the 2006 Russian Booker prize and was translated into English by Marian Schwartz (2010). Slavnikova's novel *The Man Who Couldn't Die*, which won her the Apollon Grigoriev Prize and was short-listed for both the Belkin Prize and the National Bestseller Prize, has been published in French (Gallimard) and Italian (Einaudi) translations. In January 2019, it was published in English by Columbia University Press as part of the Russian Library series. Her novel *The Jump*, was shortlisted for the Big Book Prize and received Yasnaya Polyana literary award (2018). Her books are translated in more than a dozen languages.
